

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

REPORT SUMMARY

GENERAL

1. As a result of discussions with the Director General EPC and the Regional Directors, the Edmonton Regional office agreed to:

- a) collate a list of emergency planning documents issued by EMO/EPC over the past years;
- b) recommend a procedure for controlling and issuing policy and procedural documents within EPC; and
- c) recommend a disposition for the identified documents.

METHOD

2. In October 1977, EPC officers at Ottawa and regional offices were solicited for any documents/titles readily identified at their location. In general, response was very limited. Quebec provided an extensive list and some data was received from Newfoundland, New Brunswick and EPC HQ (Mrs. Looker and DFPA).

3. The types of documents which were to be collected were those issued in a sequential or controlled process, therefore implying importance, those containing ongoing directions or procedures on functional or administrative matters and, manuals or publications issued as policy/procedure/guidance.

4. An extensive file search was made at Edmonton for documents of policy/procedural nature. The search unearthed no end of uncoordinated Canadian publications on emergency preparedness. No attempt was made to register non-Canadian documents.

5. Local records searches revealed many decisions of record in EPC/EMO/RCEAC reports. Due to the limitations of the purpose of this project the RCEAC decisions were not recorded primarily because they were seldom executed as policy or procedure in Canadian documents.

6. A list of identified documents was prepared and circulated on 16 Mar 78 to Ottawa and regions. As a result additional data was provided by RDs NB, PEI and EPC HQ (Ms Nygaard).

RECORD OF DOCUMENTS

7. A record of the documents was then collated in three parts:

- a) EMO/EPC Issued Documents.
- b) Senior Authorities.
- c) Other Government Department Documents.

8. EMO/EPC Issued Documents

Notwithstanding an EMO Directive, documents worthy of record (and many not) have been issued in a completely uncoordinated manner. A quasi system existed prior to 1968/69, however, this was followed by a flush period of loquacious unregulated paper, few if any contain any policy or direction. By 1973 complete pandemonium existed. It is unbelievable that the organization could function with no identified or current policy. However, Part I of the Record contains, as best as can be concluded, a list of documents issued by EMO/EPC. For the benefit of those who intend to dust off their dead files, the documents which have been cancelled are included in the list.

9 Senior Authorities

Although the objective of this project was to identify internal documents, the collection process produced listings of many of the authority sources for our activities. They are included to:

- a) demonstrate that many of the 'authorities' are not acts or regulations on which a coordinated planning process can be based.
- b) demonstrate that much of the source, direction or authority was never implemented or passed to regions.
- c) demonstrate the need for a review process to confirm, amend or cancel ancient doctrine.
- d) provide some historical record of decisions.

These authorities are collated in Part II of the Report. They cannot be considered complete. Regional offices do not contain many of the source documents.

10. Other Government Departments

Collection of these documents was also an adjunct to the project objective. However, it is essential that EPC officers know what is being said by other departments in emergency preparedness. The collated list is produced as Part III of this Report. Like Part II, we cannot be sure that the Report is complete.

FINDINGS

11. The search for the documents resulted in a number of conclusions:

- a) The EPC file system, designed for war planning has been bastardized for peace planning. There is no logical separation.
- b) EPC staff officers do not generally produce completed staff work. Correspondence is often routed to regions without intra HQ coordination and consultation. Seldom is material analyzed to determine what it means to EPC and how/who should implement it.
- c) EPC staff officers use pet files for their correspondence. For example, one staff element produces significant correspondence on a single file with no cross-reference of the contents to the subject file.
- d) EPC staff do not appear to have followed a development process which results in a well rounded staff officer.
- e) There has been inter-division rivalry and competition regarding volume or production. For example, one division published a circular containing a bulletin issued by another division.

RECOMMENDATIONS

12. The following recommendations are submitted for consideration by the Director General EPC:

- a) A policy directive be issued on production and distribution of EPC documents. A proposal has been made by Mr. Hoffman and Mr. Turner.
- b) A policy directive identify the material in Part I which is to be considered as ongoing EPC policy or procedure. All unlisted documents would thereby be cancelled.
- c) EPC HQ collect and publish a list of senior documents relevant to EPC.
- d) EPC HQ review the senior planning documents to identify outstanding EPC action and a subsequent work program.
- e) EPC HQ request other government departments to identify their emergency planning documents and subsequently publish a bibliography of federal emergency planning documents and decisions on record.
- f) EPC HQ close out the existing file system forthwith and initiate a replacement system.

- g) A staff training system be developed for EPC HQ to teach staff officers and clerical staff the correct use of the CR system and staff procedures.
- h) The individual proposed disposition for the documents identified in the Report is contained as an introduction to the Parts.
- j) EPC sponsor preparation of a national plan for federal response to peacetime emergencies.
- k) EPC prepare a national plan for civil operations - war.

CONCLUSION

14. This Report completes the undertaking of the Edmonton Regional office to catalogue emergency planning documents for EPC HQ.

A SUMMARY OF U.S./CANADA
AGREEMENTS IMPORTANT TO EMERGENCY PLANNING

1. The Broad Policy Agreement

General provision is made in agreement between the United States and Canada for the waiver of customs, immigration and other border crossing requirements during a period of national emergency. Reference par. 4(a), Annex to note 35, 1967 agreement between United States and Canada on Civil Emergency Planning.

2. U.S. Legal Provisions for Implementing Agreement with Respect to Customs

The U.S. Bureau of Customs has no authority to waive provisions of Tariff Act; however, section 318 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 USC 1318) provides that in event of emergency, the President may authorize the Secretary of the Treasury to permit, under appropriate regulations, the importation free of duty of food, clothing, and medical, surgical and other supplies for use in emergency relief work.

Three categories of customs requirements are affected:

- a. Waiver of navigational laws administered by the Bureau of Customs. Authority exists in the Act of December 27, 1950 (64 Stat. 1120, codified as note to section 1, Title 46, U.S.C.).
- b. Free entry of articles needed for the war effort. Authority exists for free importation of shipments by military departments (Item 832.00, Tariff Schedules of the U.S.), strategic and critical materials (40 U.S.C. 474(6), Item 833.00, Tariff Schedules of the U.S.), and source materials for the Atomic Energy Commission (Item 834.00, Tariff Schedules of the U.S.).
- c. Waiver of other customs requirements and formalities during emergency and free entry of emergency supplies. These actions must be authorized by the President. Such authorization would not automatically waive compliance with requirements, but

would permit compliance to be indefinitely delayed. The Secretary of the Treasury has proposed a Presidential Proclamation which would permit him to: (1) delay compliance for carriers involved in the war effort; (2) delay compliance for any importation by a government agency involved in the war effort; (3) delay compliance in any military or disaster area; and (4) permit free entry of emergency supplies (i. e. Red Cross, OEP, or other emergency relief agencies). These would be specifically designated by the Secretary of the Treasury. Compliance with customs requirements other than delay (e. g. suspension) would require additional legislation.

3. U.S. Provisions for Implementing Agreement with Respect to Entry of Persons, Articles, and Merchandise During Emergency.

Following the issuance of appropriate Presidential Proclamation, or upon the occurrence of an attack upon the United States, emergency provision is made for the opening or closing of certain ports of entry and for the intensification of inspections at designated ports of entry. The U.S. Bureau of Customs and the Immigration and Naturalization Service have developed coordinated instructions for implementing these measures. Reference Bureau of Customs Special Circular No. X-125, Supplement No. 22(a), June 22, 1960.

a. Instructions for opening or closing of certain ports of entry during a war-related emergency. Pursuant to Reorganization Plan No. 26 of 1950 (13 CFR, 1950 Supp. ch. III), the Secretary of the Treasury will authorize the Commissioner of Customs to carry out emergency measures which are planned as follows:

(1) Seaboard and Gulf Coast Ports will remain open so that freight and passenger traffic vital to defense may be handled expeditiously.

(2) Land border ports and Great lake ports will be closed except for some 7 on the Mexican border and 20 on the Canadian border.

(3) Airports in the same metropolitan areas as open Great lakes and land border ports will remain open.

(4) Vital rail and truck freight lines and freight ships will be allowed to cross borders at ports which are otherwise closed to passenger traffic.

(5) Authority to open, close, or designate other ports for immigration purposes is delegated to district directors. (Treasury Department Order No. 165 _____.)

b. Instructions for intensification of inspection during a war-related emergency. During a war emergency, and pursuant to authorities cited above, the Customs Service will intensify the inspection and examination of persons, articles, and merchandise arriving and departing the United States in order to detect and prevent smuggling, apprehend espionage, and to otherwise enforce wartime export controls and trade restrictions. Increased personal search of passengers is not contemplated, but a thorough search of baggage and effects will be undertaken.

Cooperatively the Immigration and Naturalization Service will undertake measures pursuant to Immigration and Naturalization Act (8 USC 1101-1503) and implementing regulations to administer strict documentary requirements and security checks on persons desiring to enter and depart -- such requirements to be waived only because of factors of public health and safety, evacuation of civilians, movement of essential materials, or extraordinary emergency.

c. Instructions regarding munitions control. In emergency U.S. collectors of customs would suspend all licenses covering shipments of munitions list items and stop all such shipments except those made on behalf of the Government. Exceptions are allowed to be made with respect to certain countries. (Bureau of Customs Special Circular Letter No. X-125, Supplement No. 14, July 8, 1958).

4. Agreement Between the United States and Canada on the Movement of Narcotic Medication During Declared Civil Defense Emergencies

This provides that medical support teams and accredited Civil Defense officials may carry narcotic medications across the border in connection with emergency missions, but will keep careful account of use so that losses may be reported immediately to proper customs officials. Agreement was concluded in an exchange of notes between Hon. Paul Martin, Minister of National Health and Welfare, Ottawa, Canada, and Mr. Anslinger, United States Commissioner of Narcotics, as endorsed by Civil Defense officials in April 1955. (U.S. implementing document is Bureau of Customs Special Circular No. X-125, Supplement No. 2, June 29, 1955).

5. Navigational and Related Waterway Maintenance Agreements Between the United States and Canada

An agreement for reciprocal waiver of customs and immigration regulations for floating equipment and personnel engaged in Seaway channel maintenance is currently in effect. Aspects of these arrangements which, by informal agreement, would be continued during emergency include:

- a. Exchange of equipment between Saint Lawrence Seaway Authority, Power Authority of New York, Ontario-Hydro and Saint Lawrence Seaway Development Corporation and the Seaway Bridge Company.
- b. Use of Moses-Saunders Power Dam for emergency crossings.
- c. Joint Seaway Regulations (The Seaway Handbook).
- d. Reciprocal Waiver for Floating Equipment and Personnel for Seaway channel maintenance.

Other agreements relating to use and navigation on waterways and which by mutual consent would be continued during emergency include:

a. U.S. /Great Britain bilateral treaty on Boundary Waters (1909). This states that ". . .navigation of all navigable boundary waters shall forever continue free and open for vessels and boats of both countries equally. . . ."

b. Memorandum of arrangements, Great Lake pilotage (1961, as revised). Provides for uniform pilotage service and working rules. Agreement periodically updated by Minister of Transport and Secretary of Transportation.

c. Emergency operating controls of shipping. Agreement exists between 9th CG District and CO Naval Division, RCN.

Other agreements by mutual acceptance exist with respect to general priorities for the emergency movement of vessels, waivers of regulations to expedite movement of dangerous cargoes, use of other country's equipment by host country, security for personnel and equipment, plans for evacuation of ports and dispersal of shipping, etc. These latter pertain only to military safety/security aspects of shipping on the waterways.

6. Agreements on Civil Aviation Between the Two Countries

A United States-Canada Air Transport Agreement (administered by CAB in U.S.) exists and would be continued in emergency. This coordinates operating arrangements in air route traffic control and flight inspection, charges and rates, use of other country's equipment by host country, and provision for waivers to expedite movement. A supplementary agreement to modify or add to these provisions to accommodate emergency conditions and allow for priorities has been proposed. (These do not apply to use of general aviation in emergency).

Additional specific agreements include:

a. Arrangements for certificates of airworthiness for export. (Department of State Executive Agreement Series EAS 129, August 1, 1938).

b. Air Traffic control agreement. (TIAS Series 5480, December 27, 1963).

c. Memorandum of understanding on U.S. -Canadian coordination and cooperation on civil aviation problems. (Sept. 12 and 26, 1957). FAA administered in United States.

d. Agreement on flight inspection services. (Feb. 10 and 21, 1967). FAA in U.S.

e. Miscellaneous agreements on loans and supply of electronic and related equipment between the two countries.

7. Agreements Between the Two Countries on Rail and Motor Transportation

During peacetime the railroads of the United States and Canada operate to a large extent on an integrated basis subject to well established industry car service rules and custom regulations; and there exists sophisticated procedures for evaluating and determining the availability of rail equipment and for its routing in response to user demand within both countries as though no border existed. It is assumed that these peacetime practices would prevail during emergency with such supplementary arrangements as mutually desired under the conditions being made for waiver or easing of customs requirements and other regulations.

The United States has standby orders to be issued by the Interstate Commerce Commission which would provide uniform priorities and otherwise ease traffic movement. Canada has been asked to adopt compatible procedures for wartime.

Motor carriers likewise operate freely between the two countries, subject to such regulations on weight, safety, etc. as may be imposed within the various states and provinces. Efforts continue to achieve compatibility in these and in emergency provisions for speeding movement and interchange of equipment both between companies and by governments. However, a number of problem areas remain.

8. Agreements on Fishing and Fisheries

U.S. /Canada cross border procedures on fish and fisheries are complicated by diverse authorities and areas of jurisdiction. The Bureau

of Commercial Fisheries of the Department of the Interior in the United States and Canadian counterparts have sponsored joint cross border meetings at national and regional levels to discuss common problems and procedures for emergency.

Procedures being developed along common lines include:

- a. Assistance to vessels of either nationality which may be directed into each other's ports, to include processing of catch, reoutfitting of vessels and crews.
- b. Joint management of fishing areas to include composition of joint fleets, catch quotas, and areas to be fished.
- c. Fishing regulations and licensing requirements by States and provinces (not yet resolved).

Financial adjustments, tariff reductions, and quality standards of fishery products are areas of further study and agreement.

9. Agreements on Food and Drug Shipments and Wholesomeness.

General agreement exists and separate but compatible guidelines are being published by the United States and Canada to expedite the cross border shipments of food in emergency and to assure wholesomeness of food so shipped. These provide for the movement of food without inspection when products originate in some or uncontaminated areas and the situation in the receiving country warrants. Otherwise meats and foods contaminated by fallout will undergo inspection to assure that standards are met. The same general procedures apply to drugs. Reference - Policy Guidelines Governing U.S. /Canadian Cross Border Movement of Food in Emergency, developed 1967-1968 by the joint U.S. /Canadian Food Committee and concurred in by FDA and Department of Agriculture in the United States.

The U.S. plans to make no distinction between Canadian and U.S. refugees in mass feeding programs that may be undertaken in emergency.

10. Agreements Between the Countries on Law and Order

The Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) have informal cooperative arrangements on matters of internal security as well as criminal activity. These involve exchange of liaison representatives, emergency radio links, and exchange of mutual assistance information. Reference - U.S. Department of Justice paper "Civil Emergency Planning Agreement Between the United States and Canada," dated January 11, 1968.

11. National Disaster Assistance

Several types of mutual assistance arrangements between the countries exist on such matters as control of forest fires and natural disaster assistance which are not tied specifically to Civil Emergency Planning Agreement.

12. Public Health and Social Welfare Agreements

Agreements on public health are being worked on by joint committees but have not been completed.

With respect to welfare, no agreements now exist though DHEW would like to work with the Canadian staffs on this. Funding is a problem.

13. Cooperative Arrangements at National Level in Resources Management and Defense Production

Under agreed procedures, each country's requirements for production materials which are processed as part of emergency claimancy procedure during emergency would be handled like similar requests received in the home country. Direct exchanges between war production agencies are authorized. The priorities and allocations consequently made would be in accord with treatment shown to like domestic programs. However, no compatible priorities have been worked out. Reference - par. 2h, OEP Circular 8500.5, August 12, 1966.

14. Cooperative Arrangements at Local Level

States and Regional offices report that there have been exchanges of views with provinces on emergency planning arrangements at the local level and that cooperation has been achieved in flood and other disasters, seismic warning services, reservoir control, emergency airlifts of aid, and in firefighting. Some formal procedures for emergency assistance have been drafted, e. g. between North Dakota and the Provinces of Saskatchewan and Manitoba, between Washington and British Columbia.

These pertain to treatment of refugees, emergency public information including warning, use of access and evacuation routes, mutual air and firefighting, joint exercises and tests, marshalling points, etc. Many of these are merely gentlemen's agreements or older civil defense arrangements and have not been formally documented.
